About the Project: Northern Animal Health Initiative (NAHI)

Ukraine Emergency Response Program started in March 2022 as a strong reaction to the urgent need for food, water, medicine, and veterinary help in Ukraine during the war. For the last six months, VWB has supported 132,000 animals with food, medicine and veterinarian care in cooperation with our local partners UPAW, Happy Paw and Glad Pet.

Today the VWB's Ukraine Program has several components:

- Animal welfare basic need (providing humanitarian food to shelters and pet owners)
- Preventative health care and treatment (vaccination, parasite treatment, spay/neuter programs)
- Online veterinarian consultations for pet owners
- Learning, best practices sharing and awareness raising (webinars for pet owners and veterinarians, informational campaigns about spaying/neutering)
