Key Responsibilities

• Donor Prospecting:

Research and compile a list of relevant funding opportunities (grants, philanthropic partnerships, foundations, CSR programs) available to locally registered nonprofit partners in priority countries, including Ukraine and Ghana.

Opportunity Analysis:

Develop detailed overviews of selected funding opportunities including eligibility, thematic focus, deadlines, and application processes.

• Proposal Support:

Collaborate with VWB staff and association partners to support the development and assembly of compelling grant proposals, letters of inquiry, and donor communications.

• Fundraising Toolkit Development:

Design a practical fundraising toolkit tailored to the needs of local association partners, including sample appeals, donor mapping templates, proposal guides, budgeting tools, and resource links.

• Knowledge Sharing:

Share best practices, fundraising trends, and insights to build long-term capacity of partners in donor engagement.
